part program that combines the Basic Marksmanship Course, Qualification Awards and Air Rifle Competition into a well-rounded activity.

Recent Notable Activities/Events:

- Seven shooters competed in the 2016 US Army Junior Marksmanship Sectional Match on Sunday 20 November. The Warrenton Rifles had six in the sporter class, and one in the precision class. The Warrenton Rifles Cobra Team is currently in 1st place (Virginia) in the sporter class, with a 2048-45. At present, the Warrenton Rifles are in 14th place nationally for participation in the USAJM National Competition.
- Individually (Virginia), Jacob secured 1st place with a 523-12, Sam in 2nd place with a 522-14, John in 4th place with a 505-10, Dylan in 5th with a 498-9, Hunter in 6th with a 494-9 and Ryan in 7th place with a 484-10. Our congratulations to Jacob, Sam, John, Dylan, Hunter G, and Ryan on an excellent job representing Post 72 and the "Warrenton Rifles".
- Our congratulations also go out to Sean who did very well in the USAJM with a 13th place finish in the State of Virginia with a 552-16.
- We would like to announce that Sean has been accepted to the shoot with the Mavericks Precision High School (ad hoc) Shooting Team. Mavericks participate in the Potomac Area High School League. Sean primary affiliation remains with the Warrenton Rifles and will be supporting the Mavericks to fine tune his precision skills. Congratulations to Sean for his acceptance to the Mavericks.
- The Warrenton Rifles sent seven senior shooters to the 2016 King George's CMP sanctioned 3x20 match on 28 October. Sean, shooting precision class finished 14th place with a very respectable 566-33. Sean scored his second perfect 100 on his first prone target. Outstanding!! Sean did a fantastic job recovering from a rifle malfunction in standing and continuing his competition with stellar focus in the kneeling position. Great job Sean!! The Cobra team, finished with an outstanding 2nd place finish with a 2003-30 in the sporter class. Congratulations to John, Jacob, Carson &

Dylan for a great performance! Individually, John finished in 4th place with a 512-8, Jacob in 10th place with a 502-8, Dylan in 12th place with a 496-9, Carson in 13th with a 493-5, Ryan 14th with a 491-8, and Hunter G 21st with a 477-4. Outstanding job shooters!
