American Legion Junior Shooting Sports Program (ALJSSP):

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The American Legion Junior Shooting Sports Program is a gun safety education and marksmanship program that encompasses the basic elements of safety, education, enjoyment and competition. Shooters use the .177 caliber air rifle. Both males and females can participate, through Legion sponsorship. Junior Shooting Sports is a three-part program that combines the Basic Marksmanship Course, Qualification Awards and Air Rifle Competition into a wellrounded activity.

The Post 72 Junior Shooting Sports Team is up and running with its 2013 / 2014 season. This last month, we welcomed two new shooters, Jackson and Penny to the Post 72 Team. Jackson and Penny will be taking the American Legion Basic Marksmen Course (BMC) along with John, Zack, and Savannah. Once the course is completed, they will be qualified to compete in the American Legion and other sanctioned competitions in the area.

We would also like to welcome Quentin Peach on board as a Certified 4H Rifle Instructor/Coach. Quentin will be assisting the current cadre with weekly practices and competitions. Quentin is a member of Post 72 and is also closely involved with the Post 72 scouting program as the Advisor to Crew 600.

The Team as a whole continues to enhance their 3 position shooting skills. A specific example is Max H. who recorded a new personal and Post 72 Team high score of 254. Congratulations to Max on his outstanding accomplishment!

As mentioned last month, the Post 72 Team will be competing in six competitions with the Old Dominion Junior Rifle League (ODJRL). This year, the Post 72 Team cadre is teaming up with the Post 290 ALJSSP Team cadre to open a new "ODJRL North" location. The new location will be hosted at Post 290, in Stafford, VA, and will be supported by the Post 72 cadre and Orion scoring system. Not only will the closer location save the Post 72 Team almost two hours driving time each month, it will open up the completion to several more ALJSSP teams in Northern Virginia. Mark your calendars: The scheduled competitions so far are: 12 October, 9 November, and 14 December. We will try to schedule the Post 72 team mid morning.
