The American Legion Junior Shooting Sports Program is a gun safety education and marksmanship program that encompasses the basic elements of safety, education, enjoyment and competition. Shooters use the .177 caliber air rifle. Both males and females can participate, through Legion sponsorship. Junior Shooting Sports is a three-part program that combines the Basic Marksmanship Course, Qualification Awards and Air Rifle Competition into a well-rounded activity.

On 7 March, the Post 72 Air Rifle Team was shocked to learn of the loss of our Senior Range Safety Officer, Mr. Bill Gouldthorpe, to a tragic sudden illness. Mr. Bill was a founding Cadre member to the Team and will be greatly missed. The Team's current members, and several graduated Team members, showed their compassion and support for the Goldthorpe family, by attending, in mass, Mr. Bill's viewing and wearing the teams red hoodies in Bill's memory.

- Chris and Isaiah have successfully completed the American Legion Basic Marksmanship Certification, entitling them to compete in all sanctioned American Legion Matches.
