Shooters use the .177 caliber air rifle. Both males and females can participate, through Legion sponsorship. Junior Shooting Sports is a three-part program that combines the Basic

Marksmanship Course, Qualification Awards and Air Rifle Competition into a well-rounded activity.

#### **Recent Notable Activities/Events:**

- Sean participated in the 2017 US Olympic Junior Sectional match (1x60 Standing) for the State of Virginia on December 18<sup>th</sup>. This was Sean's second national qualifier as a precision class shooter. Sean shot an outstanding 264-27, earning him a 1<sup>st</sup> place finish in this sectional match. Sean score is very likely to earn him an invitation to the US Olympic Junior National Match at the US Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, CO in April.

Nationally out of 727 participants, Jacob S placed 80<sup>th</sup>, Sam placed 85<sup>th</sup>, John 176<sup>th</sup>, Dylan 209<sup>th</sup>, Hunter G 224<sup>th</sup>, and Ryan 262<sup>nd</sup>. Congratulations to the Warrenton Rifles for an excellent job.
- Sean also participated in the 2017 US Army Junior Marksmanship Qualifier, precision class (1x60 standing, (Virginia). This was his first major competition as a precision shooter. Sean placed 14<sup>th</sup> in Virginia with a 552-17 and place 160<sup>th</sup> nationally out of 386 shooters. An excellent first showing.
- It is an honor, but with some sadness, we announce that Abram Baer, a graduate Warrenton Rifle athlete and current coach, will be reporting for basic training with the United States Marine Corps the first week of January 2017. Abram shot with the Rifles from October 2013 through August 2106, becoming a keystone member of the Cobra Team. While with the Rifles, Abram participated in numerous state & regional level competitions, three national competitions, and earned the NRA

Distinguished Expert in Junior Air Rifle, and the Civilian Marksmanship Programs Gold Distinguished Junior Marksman Badge.
