## **Legion Riders News**

August is always a busy month for motorcycle enthusiasts and the American Legion Riders are certainly flush with motor fans from all walks of life. As enjoyable as a summer ride can be down the byways of Virginia, we are all frequently reminded of the danger associated with riding a motorcycle even in large groups on less travelled roadways. Nationwide in 2015, more than 4500 motorcyclists lost their lives, many of those involving contact with another motor vehicle or in an attempt to avoid contact. While accidents do happen and there may be no explanation for all of them, many of these fatalities could have been avoided if both drivers and riders were more alert to their surroundings. Although the 2016 statistics are not yet released, it is expected that these numbers remained fairly flat last year.

As a public engagement arm of the American Legion, the ALR would like to remind riders to exercise particular caution when operating motorcycles on roadways shared by other motor vehicles and to personally take responsibility for your safety and the safety of those around you by adhering to the laws and rules of the road whenever you are riding. Be alert for distracted drivers and give yourself plenty of room to maneuver should the need arise. Ensure your motorcycle is in good running order (or as good as possible for foreign motorcycles) especially making sure your machine is well lit and all signals are bright and operational. If riding in a group, maintain a close but safe distance between motorcycles and remain alert for cars that may want to join in on the ride without invitation. Finally, always take the high road by avoiding confrontations

with other road users and elect to slow down or pull off in order to live another day to ride. Each member of our group is a precious possession and we want everyone to ride safe and stay alert.

In September, the ALR is looking forward to its first group ride this season, a ride on the famous skyline drive following by an evening of camping at the Willville Motorcycle Campground, Meadows of Dan, VA. We will depart the legion on September 9<sup>th</sup> and return late on September 10<sup>th</sup>. We are excited for this opportunity to stretch our legs on a long ride and then tell motorcycle war stories around the campfire while we sip hot chocolate and eat Smores (or similar).

The ALR is also proud to announce a charity event being hosted by fellow veteran Motorcycle club. The desert Knights will be hosting the 3d Annual Desert Knights MC Dustoff benefitting the Fisher House charities, The event will be held at American Legion Post 28 in Triangle, Virginia from 2PM to 7 PM and will include live music, drawings, and plenty of motorcycle games.
